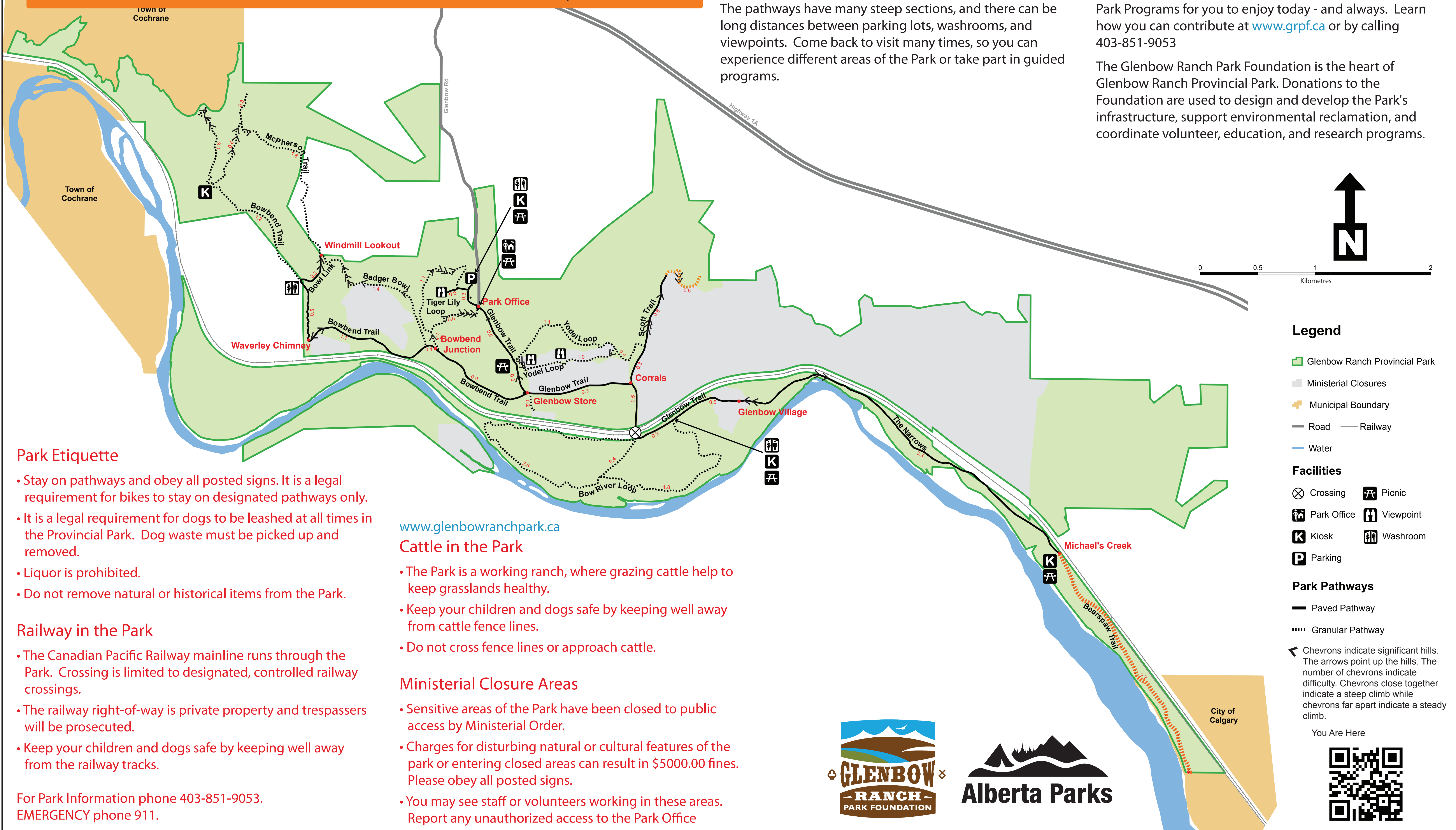
Have a Great Day at the Park!

Park Etiquette

- Stay on pathways and obey all posted signs. It is a legal requirement for bikes to stay on designated pathways only.
- It is a legal requirement for dogs to be leashed at all times in the Provincial Park. Dog waste must be picked up and removed.
- Liquor is prohibited.
- Do not remove natural or historical items from the Park.

Railway in the Park

- The Canadian Pacific Railway mainline runs through the Park. Crossing is limited to designated, controlled railway crossings.
- The railway right-of-way is private property and trespassers will be prosecuted.
- Keep your children and dogs safe by keeping well away from the railway tracks.

Cattle in the Park

- The Park is a working ranch, where grazing cattle help to keep grasslands healthy.
- Keep your children and dogs safe by keeping well away from cattle fence lines.
- Do not cross fence lines or approach cattle.

Ministerial Closure Areas

- Sensitive areas of the Park have been closed to public access by Ministerial Order.
- Charges for disturbing natural or cultural features of the park or entering closed areas can result in \$5000.00 fines. Please obey all posted signs.
- You may see staff or volunteers working in these areas. Report any unauthorized access to the Park Office
