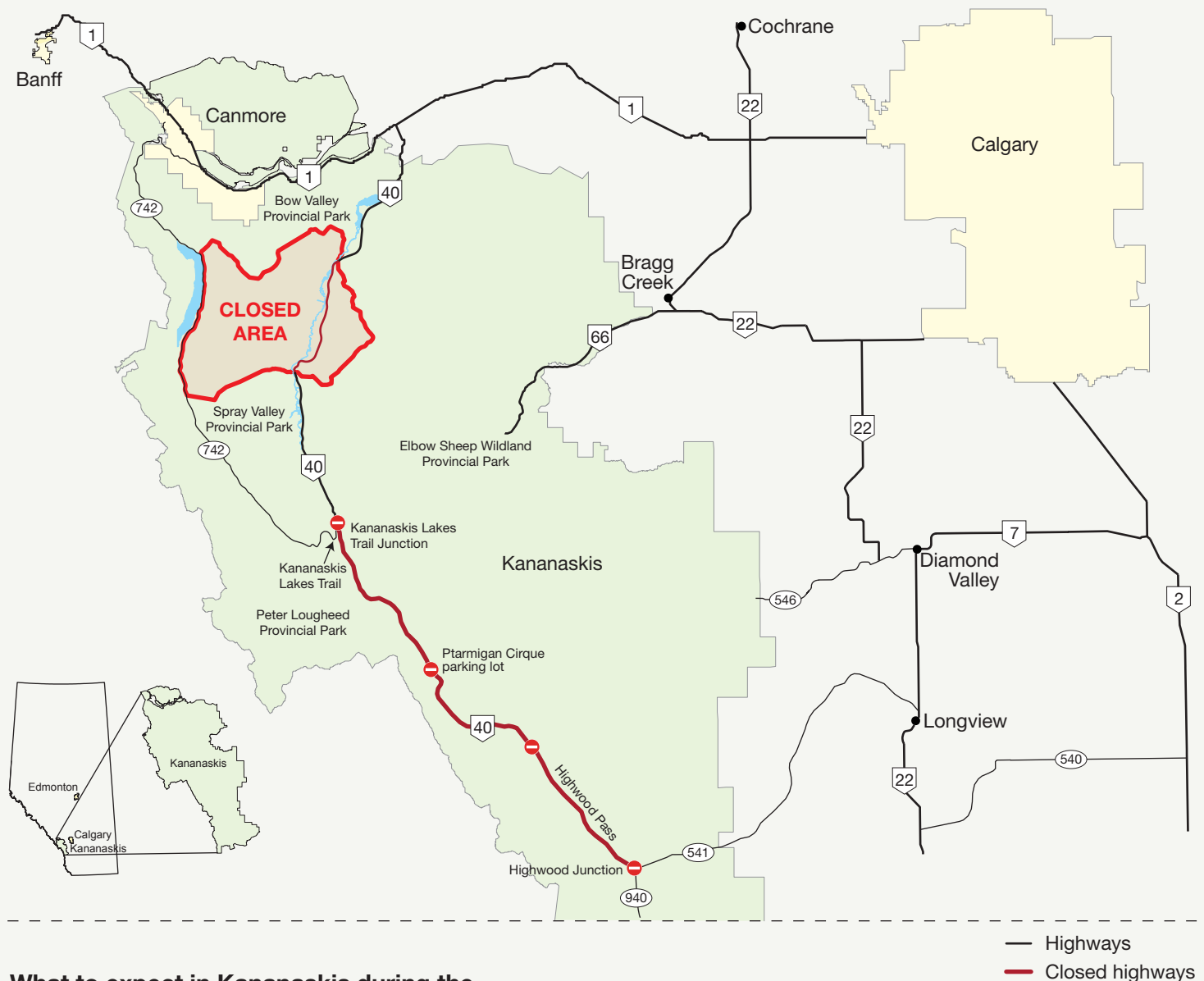

G7 Summit Kananaskis Highway Impacts



What to expect in Kananaskis during the G7 Leaders' Summit

As Alberta prepares to host the 2025 G7 Leaders' Summit in Kananaskis from **June 15 to 17**, select roads, campgrounds, day-use areas, and trails in the area will be temporarily closed before, during, and after the Summit.

The RCMP will establish a controlled access zone which will be closed to the general public from **June 10-18**. A section of Highway 40 will be closed between Mount Lorette Ponds and Galatea day use areas.

The Highwood Pass (Highway 40 from Highwood Junction to the Kananaskis Lakes Trail Junction) will be closed to vehicle traffic until **June 21**. From **June 1 to 20** cyclists and pedestrians can still access the Highwood Pass via the south and will be turned around just north of the Ptarmigan Cirque parking lot. There will be no cyclist or pedestrian access from the north.

Some roads, campgrounds, day-use areas and trails on this map may be affected for longer than the dates indicated.
